



In reference to the information released today by Sernapesca, indicating Salmones Camanchaca's fish mortalities due to algae bloom, the Company considers necessary to add and clarify the information, as follows,

1. For algae blooms situations, the Company has in place devices that under certain conditions, allow mitigating the harmful effects, in addition to biomass insurance coverage.
2. During the course of this week, we detected the presence of a type of harmful algae in the vicinity of Pilpilehue farming site, in Chiloé, where Salmones Camanchaca is currently farming 2.2 million Atlantic salmon. During the first hours of Thursday, March 14, the Company registered an abnormal mortality due to this algae condition. At this date and time, the mortality conditions are totally normal.
3. The accumulated mortality during this week in Pilpilehue site, reached 58 thousand fish approximately, that is, 2.6% of the total fish of this specific farming site, and 0.4% of the total Company's fish in the sea water.
4. The Company considers that although the mortality of March 14 was abnormal, it is not a material event and can be handled operationally with its talents, available devices and protocols.
5. Salmones Camanchaca does not have other farming sites with abnormal mortality due to algae or other causes.
6. All in, Salmones Camanchaca has activated the protocols defined for these conditions, including the use of equipment and human talents, in addition to the corresponding notice to the biomass's insurer.
7. If in the future Salmones Camanchaca has information of a material event that might affect its financial conditions, operations and/or environmental management, the Company will communicate such material event without delays.
